



Accessibility Plan: 2025 Update

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1 Background

In 2023 the Town of Antigonish published its first Accessibility Plan. Barriers to accessibility were assessed throughout the Town and a list of actions was created to support the removal of these barriers. The implementation of our Accessibility Plan was put on hold, along with other strategic plans, as the Town of Antigonish and the Municipality of the County of Antigonish explored consolidation into one municipal unit. Through this time many long-term issues important to residents were deferred until the future of the municipalities were decided

Since the decision not to consolidate was made the Town has restarted implementing the original 2023 Accessibility Plan. We recognize that more action is needed to truly advance accessibility in Antigonish. To support this, we engaged in a process to update and refresh the Plan's actions that address the needs of residents in our community. To support an update on the Plan's progress we retained the accessibility consulting firm, Left Turn Right Turn (LTRT) to support the Plan review and update process. The following sections outline the findings of this process.

2 What We Heard: Community Consultations

2.1 Background

As part of the progress evaluation, we worked with an external consultant to carry out community consultations about the state of accessibility in Antigonish. The purpose of these engagements was to gather feedback about accessibility from residents and stakeholders in Antigonish.

These activities included two pop-up style community engagements at the Antigonish Farmer's Market and The People's Place, the Pictou-Antigonish Regional Library. LTRT staff facilitated an online drop in consultation for community members. Both the pop-ups and the online consultation were held in late February 2025. We also presented the original plan to the Town's Accessibility Advisory Committee for feedback on our progress in early March 2025. People were asked about the current state of accessibility in Antigonish, what they thought of the original plan's actions, what has been going well, and what we could improve on going forward.

2.2 Feedback Summary

Overall, community members had a low level of awareness about the existence of our 2023 Accessibility Plan. It is likely that the Town's consolidation review process with the County may have decreased visibility of the Accessibility Plan. Some community members, including members of our Accessibility Advisory Committee, noted that the timelines for certain actions were too long and should be shortened. Many community members were happy to see accessibility in Antigonish getting a specific focus in community outreach and engagement activities. This feedback showed us that we have room to improve how we communicate with residents about accessibility and ensuring that we communicate all information in accessible formats.

We received a lot of feedback about barriers to accessibility in the Town's public spaces and infrastructure. We received positive feedback about the accessibility improvements made to The Sandlot Ballfield and how these improvements have helped more people access the outdoors in our community. We heard specifically that some intersections presented barriers for people with various disabilities due to cracked or heaving sidewalks, the absence of curb cuts and tactile walking surface indicators, and traffic signals without accessibility features like audible chirps. We also received feedback about accessible seating options around the Town and in Town parks and recreation facilities. Some residents shared they were happy to see and use accessible picnic tables in certain parks, but others highlighted the need for more seating overall in Antigonish, and specifically in the downtown area.

Residents shared that the lack of public transportation options in Antigonish create significant barriers for people with disabilities and that the private and non-profit options do not adequately meet the needs of residents. We also received a lot of feedback about the availability of accessible parking spaces in Antigonish. Many residents felt there aren't enough spaces available and the ones that are can often be blocked by vehicles using the space without a permit. Some people commented that parking kiosks have not been installed at accessible heights and there were also questions about the level of monitoring to prevent misuse of the spots by those without a permit. Another issue identified was the lack of

consistent design standards resulting in some spaces being inaccessible due to other street infrastructure, like fire hydrants or utility poles, being in the way.

People we engaged with felt that, overall, accessibility needs to be much more highly prioritized in Antigonish but are willing to recognize when advancements have been achieved. We are grateful to all the community members who took the time to share their feedback and lived experience with us.

3 Progress Made to Date

3.1 Overview

As a result of the feedback we received from members of our community and insights provided by Town staff and our Accessibility Advisory Committee, we will continue to implement the actions in our 2023 plan. We have not added any new actions to the Plan at this time. We recognize that having an implementation timeline is critical to our accessibility efforts and we have made designating timelines for each action item our first priority going forward.

3.2 Awareness and Education

Establish clear staff responsibilities for an Accessibility Coordinator position or designate.	In progress. Having an accessible lens for Town operations and projects will be the responsibility of the Chief Administrative Officers and the Directors.
Explore Opportunities to fund accessible equipment.	Ongoing We will be cost-sharing the purchase of an accessible picnic table for the Mini-Pitch facility and will continue to work with community partners to identify other equipment needed.

We partner with the RCMP to assist with enforcement and community concerns can be brought forward to the Town’s Police & Licensing Committee.</p>
<p>Improve the physical accessibility of parking lots.</p>	<p>In progress.</p>
<p>Complete a parking review.</p>	<p>Not started.</p> <p>A review of municipal parking facilities was started prior to the COVID-19 pandemic but this review was not completed.</p> <p>In the 2025-2026 capital budget, there is a request for two new parking kiosks; one to replace a kiosk that is not accessible, and another to replace parking meters in the Town’s largest parking lot in the downtown core.</p>

4 Monitoring our Progress

We understand that our accessibility journey does not end with the publication of this updated accessibility plan, and to make lasting change in Antigonish we will need to monitor and regularly report on the progress of accessibility initiatives. To support this and to provide greater transparency and accountability to the Antigonish community we have committed to presenting a yearly report to the Accessibility Advisory Committee on our progress.
